The Plymouth County Board of Supervisors met on September 15, 2006 at 8:30 a.m. to canvass the School Board Election held on September 12, 2006. Present were Vice-Chairman Henrich, Schneider, Greene and Anderson. Absent was Sitzmann.

Motion by Schneider, seconded by Greene, to approve the canvass of the School Board Election as follows:

AKRON-WESTFIELD

For the office of Director District 1 there were fifty-eight (58) votes cast as follows: Kevin DeRocher received fifty-seven (57) votes; scattering received one (1) vote. We therefore declare Kevin DeRocher elected for the office of Director District 1 for the term of 3 years.

For the office of Director District 2 there were fifty-seven (57) votes cast as follows: Phil Parks received fifty-six (56) votes; scattering received one (1) vote. We therefore declare Phil Parks elected for the office of Director District 2 for the term of 3 years.

HINTON COMMUNITY

For the office of Director At Large there were three hundred fifty-eight (358) votes as follows: Steve Eddy received one hundred forty-two (142) votes; Robert D. Held received one hundred seven (107) votes; Michelle K. Rodgers received one hundred six (106) votes; scattering received three (3) votes. We therefore declare Steve Eddy and Robert D. Held elected for the office of Director At Large for the term of 3 years.

KINGSLEY-PIERSON

For the office of Director District 1 there were one hundred four (104) votes as follows: Karl Seggerman received forty-four (44) votes; Shari Seuntjens received fifty-three (53) votes; scattering received seven (7) votes. We therefore declare Shari Seuntjens elected for the office of Director District 1 for the term of 3 years.

For the office of Director District 2 there were one hundred forty one (141) votes as follows: Clayton Powell received one hundred thirty-one (131) votes; scattering received ten (10) votes. We therefore declare Clayton Powell elected for the office of Director District 2 for the term of 3 years.

Upon the public measure: *“Shall the Board of Directors of the Kingsley-Pierson Community School District in the Counties of Plymouth, Woodbury, and Cherokee, State of Iowa, for the purpose of purchasing and improving grounds; constructing schoolhouses or buildings and opening roads to schoolhouses or buildings; purchasing of buildings and the purchase of equipment; paying debts contracted for the erection or construction of schoolhouses or buildings, not including interest on bonds; procuring or acquisition of libraries; repairing, remodeling, reconstructing, improving, or expanding the schoolhouses or buildings and additions to existing schoolhouses; expenditures for energy conservation; renting facilities under Chapter 28E; purchasing transportation equipment for transporting students; lease purchase option agreements for school buildings or equipment; purchasing equipment authorized by law; or for any purpose or purposes now or hereafter authorized by law, be authorized for a period of ten years to levy and impose a voter-approved physical plant and equipment tax of not exceeding sixty seven cents (67¢) per One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) of assessed valuation of the taxable property within the school district, and be authorized annually, in combination, as determined by the board, to levy a physical plant and equipment property tax upon all the taxable property within the school district commencing with the levy of property taxes for collection in the fiscal year ending June 30, 2008, and to impose a physical plant and equipment income surtax upon the state individual income tax of each individual income taxpayer resident in the school district on December 31 for each calendar year commencing with calendar year 2007, or each year thereafter?”*

There were one hundred sixty-two (162) votes cast as follows:
FOR the question, there were one hundred fourteen (114) votes
AGAINST the question, there were forty-eight (48) votes

We therefore declare the public measure Kingsley-Pierson Community School PPEL to be adopted.

LEMARS COMMUNITY

For the office of Director District 1 there were eighty-seven (87) votes cast as follows: Leon E. Scott received eighty-seven (87) votes. We therefore declare Leon E. Scott elected for the office of Director District 1 for the term of 3 years.

For the office of Director District 4 there were ninety-two (92) votes cast as follows: Brenda Phelan received ninety-two (92) votes. We therefore declare Brenda Phelan elected for the office of Director District 4 for the term of 3 years.

REMSEN-UNION

For the office of Director District 1 there were thirteen (13) votes cast as follows: Travis J. Tentinger received thirteen (13) votes. We therefore declare Travis J. Tentinger elected for the office of Director District 1 for the term of 3 years.

For the office of Director District 5 there were three (3) votes cast as follows: Mark J. Wurth received three (3) votes. We therefore declare Mark J. Wurth elected for the office of Director District 5 for the term of 3 years.

WESTERN IOWA TECH COMMUNITY COLLEGE

For the office of Western Iowa Tech Director, District VIII, there were one hundred forty-one (141) votes cast as follows: Russell C. Wray received one hundred thirty-nine (139) votes; scattering received two (2) votes.
