All votes following are a roll call vote of an aye per each board member, unless otherwise indicated. Board Chairman Don Kass called the meeting to order and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Motion by Anderson, seconded by Meis, to approve the 1/20/26 Board meeting agenda. Motion Carried.

Motion by Manley, seconded by Van Otterloo, to approve the 1/13/26 Board meeting minutes. Motion Carried.

Motion by Anderson, seconded by Van Otterloo, to approve the 1/20/26 claims paid and payroll issued 1/15/26 and 1/6/26. Motion Carried.

Motion by Van Otterloo, seconded by Manley, to approve the FY2025 LAE Cost Allocation Plan for DHS for FY26-27 funding of \$36,119. Motion Carried.

The Board of Supervisors presented the County's wage increase proposal for FY 2026-27 to the members of the Plymouth County Secondary Road Bargaining Unit for a \$1.32 per hour increase and for a \$.23 per hour increase to the standby pay taking it up to \$.63 from the current standby pay of \$.40; which is the same proposal that the Secondary Road Bargaining Unit proposed. Therefore, an agreement shall be met and the final contract will be prepared for approval and signed at the Ply. County Board of Supervisors' meeting on 2/3/26.

Conservation Director, Nick Beeck introduced Skyler Foley the new County Conservation Park Ranger who began on 1/15/26. Previous Park Ranger, Luke Hughes, resigned in November 2025.

Rebecca Socknat, Plymouth County EMA Director presented the FY 2025-26 budget amendment and the FY 2026-27 budget; with a request of \$125,028 (\$25,698 for Hazmat & \$99,330 for operating funds) from the County general supplemental fund for FY 2026-27.

Motion by Meis, seconded by Manley, to approve the FY 2024-2025 Conservation annual report as presented by Nick Beeck, Conservation Director. Motion Carried.

Tom Rohe, County Engineer reviewed the FY 2026-27 Secondary Road budget.

The Plymouth County Board of Supervisors discussed the FY 2026-27 budget. The Board discussed and concluded not to make the current Conservation part time Naturalist position into a full-time position, reducing the Conservation budget by \$17,000 and to reduce the Plymouth County Secondary Road budget by \$4,800 by not approving additional salary increases for FY 2026-27.

Ryan Berven, Assured Partners President, presented the Plymouth County insurance outlook for the FY 2026-27, new insurance rates and the plan changes with ICAP/Wellmark for Plymouth County.
